

Commercial pitch to delegates at National Security Conference

Although the government has placed national security firmly on the agenda, it has done so against a backdrop of constrained budgets following the Strategic Defence and Security Review.

The ECAC approved *Kromek Identifier* is a state-of-the-art bottle scanner that uses multispectral x-ray technology to 'fast-scan' and identify the presence of threats in liquids, aerosols and gels (LAGs) in any type/shape of container (opaque/clear glass, plastic, metal, cardboard), providing the highest probability of detection.
